Carteret Emergency Services Receive Federal, State Funding

Mayor Daniel J. Reiman announced that the Borough will receive \$637,195 in federal funds for the new \$2.5 million OEM relocation and the fire department will receive a \$75,000 state grant.

U.S. Rep. Frank Pallone Jr. (D-6th) secured the appropriations for a high-tech communications system as part of the federal Fiscal Year 2024 budget.

"We are thrilled and extremely grateful to Congressman Frank Pallone for these much-needed funds that go a long way to update and modernize our emergency preparedness and response to critical situations," Mayor Reiman said. "As an urban coastal community that's a stone's throw from New York City, preparedness is key to preventing, mitigating, and recovering from natural and man-made disasters. We applaud Congressman Pallone's efforts to secure funding toward this project."

Rep. Pallone said he was glad he was able to deliver critical funding to help the Carteret OEM with its communications technology and emergency response infrastructure.

[•]This funding will help give first responders the resources they need to respond to emergencies quickly and efficiently," Rep. Pallone said. "I'm glad we were able to get this funding across the finish line."

The new headquarters will allow a fully-staffed response team to better gather information and coordinate emergency responses. The OEM Building serves as a dispatch center and 911 backup call center.

The OEM headquarters will feature offices and conference areas where Borough officials can develop and coordinate emergency responses. The upgrades also will include sufficient storage space for non-perishable foods, bottled water, portable generators and other necessities.

The state grant to the fire department was awarded by the Department of Community Affairs through the American Rescue Plan Firefighter Grant program. Fire departments may use ARP grants to buy protective clothing, such as turnout gear, breathing apparatuses, and equipment for personal safety, virus protection, and sanitizing or decontamination.

"This kind of equipment will go a long way to help keep safe those who help keep the community safe," Fire Chief Mark Hruska said.

Earth Day Celebration Will Feature Honored Carteret Eco Dress Designer

Carteret High School junior Savnoor Kaur will demonstrate her recyclable "Lost Beauty" gown on April 20 in Carteret Park as part of the Third Annual Carteret Earth Day Celebration.

The last time she presented her acclaimed work was in February in Monaco at Junk Kouture, the world's largest sustainable fashion contest.

"We are extremely proud of Savnoor and her amazing accomplishment representing Carteret at such a prestigious event," Mayor Daniel J. Reiman said. "We look forward to her presenting her work at the Carteret Earth Day Celebration."

Being only one of 10 U.S. high school students chosen to compete in Junk Kouture was an unbelievable honor, Kaur said. It marked the first time she ever modeled, and to do so on the fashionable French Riviera was daunting, she said.

Junk Kouture challenges ages 13 to 19 worldwide to create an original couture made entirely from recyclable waste. "Lost Beauty" was chosen from more than 1,600 entries from students in 20 nations on six continents.

"Lost Beauty' is an homage to my culture's traditional Indian lehenga," Kaur said. "But instead of the floor-length skirts, decorative blouses and shawl-like scarfs called dupatta that usually make up lehenga, I used old plastic bottles, bags, table covers, twigs, dried leaves, recycled cardboard and paper, including pieces of old homework and textbooks, and pieces of old clothing and shoes. It took three months to complete, so it was challenging but also fun to design and complete."

Savnoor's art teacher, Susan M. Catrone routinely seeks innovative ways to inspire students.

After she heard about Junk Kouture at an Art Educators of New Jersey Conference, she inspired them to enter the competition. Subsequent student interest led Catrone and fellow Carteret High School art teacher Jacqueline Lachiver to co-sponsor the new Junk Kouture Club.

"Our school is always proud when our students are recognized for their work and dedication," Catrone said. "We are a small town but have immense pride in our community. It was an especially proud moment to see Savnoor on the world stage."

While Catrone was unable to travel to Monaco, Savnoor was accompanied by Lachiver; her mother, Kulwinder Kaur, and her grandfather, Jaspal Singh Multani.

Rather than pursue a career in fashion design, however, the honor student hopes to study medicine to become a surgeon.



Salva's artwork was submitted to both contests by her high school art teacher Susan Catrone.





Biz Profile: China Wok

Much to the delight of the foot traffic within the Carteret Shopping Center, the brother-and-sister team of Ting and Guang Li have opened China Wok, a tasty takeout spot that launched late last year.

Guang is the owner, and Ting manages a good deal of operations. Both worked in their family's beloved eatery, China King Buffet, which was located next to the shopping center's ShopRite anchor.

"We served the town for 20 years," Ting Li said. "Unfortunately, due to the prolonged impact of the COVID-19 situation, we made the difficult decision to close that business. When she and her brother learned there was an available spot in the shopping center, they said they saw it as another chance to continue serving their community.

"We cherish our connection to this beautiful town," Ting Li said. "We noticed that there aren't many high-quality Chinese restaurants in Carteret, and we wanted to fill that gap. Our decision to open a restaurant here is driven by our love for the town and our desire to provide delicious food to our neighbors.

"I absolutely adore Carteret," she continued. "It's a charming, peaceful small town with incredibly friendly residents. I have formed deep connections with many people in this town, who feel like close friends to me. It's this sense of community and warmth that inspired me to choose Carteret once again as the location for my Chinese restaurant. Our welcoming atmosphere encourages people to not only enjoy delicious food but also to engage in friendly conversations with us. We take pride in providing a warm and inviting environment where everyone feels welcome, and this personal touch is what keeps customers coming back."

China Wok's signature dish is General Tso's Chicken because it perfectly embodies the balance of sweet and spicy flavors that China Wok strives to deliver in its cuisine, Ting Li said.

The dish has become a favorite among customers with an irresistible taste that satisfies a combination of flavors, she said.





Up to \$100 Available to Residents of Carteret in Verizon Settlement

Verizon customers may be eligible for part of a \$100 million settlement that would pay out between \$15 and \$100, but you may have to apply.

The company agreed to settle claims that it charged "deceptive and unfair" administrative fees that were not properly disclosed to some wireless customers.

About 58 million affected customers should have received a notification by email or mailed postcard in January. The notifications include a "Notice ID" and "Confirmation Code," which can be used to sign up for the settlement.

If you didn't get one, you can sign up on the settle-

ment website by entering your name and Verizon account number on the website.

Eligible consumers include current and former Verizon customers who had wireless or data services between Jan. 1, 2016, and Nov. 8, 2023. They are eligible for up to \$100, but not less than \$15, the settlement said.

Fees involved ranged from 40 cents to \$3.30 a month per line, with costs increasing over time, according to the lawsuit.

Consumers have until April 15 to file at verizonadministrativechargesettlement.com.
