MCIA Downtown Parking Garage Now Open to Residents, Visitors & Businesses

Middlesex County Improvement Authority's High Street Parking Garage adjacent to 29 Washington Avenue recently opened to the public and local businesses.

The parking garage is one of five planned by the County Division of Parking to help promote economic development throughout Middlesex County.

"We're looking forward to the great benefit the parking garage will have on our residents, businesses and visitors to our restaurants and state-of-the-art Carteret Performing Arts Center," Mayor Daniel J. Reiman said.

"The parking garage will impact the Downtown Carteret Arts District, which has had a huge redevelopment with new restaurants, the performing arts center, and apartment buildings," added Tom Merli, MCIA's director of parking. "Now that this garage is open to the public, it will support local businesses and residents in that area. We really wanted to support the performing arts center with safe, secure parking, as well as commuters and daily parkers who are using the arts district for restaurants."

With a capacity of more than 400, the six-level parking garage will be open from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily. A total of 14 American Disabilities Actcompliant spaces are available closest to the elevators on each level.

Daily rates are:

- 0-2 Hours \$2
- 2-4 Hours \$3
- 4-6 Hours \$4
- 6-8 Hours \$5
- Over 8 Hours \$6.

"For only \$6, the parking garage is perfect for commuters who catch the bus on Washington Avenue with safe, secure, weather-protected parking," Merli said. "We also provide parking for all Carteret PAC events at a flat rate of \$20. The event rate goes into effect two hours prior to a scheduled PAC Event."

During PAC events, the garage stays open later than 10 p.m., the parking director said.

MCIA recently installed a new state-of-the-art parking revenue control system from IP Parking with license plate recognition cameras for enhanced safety, Merli said. The system offers several convenient payment options:

• Cash or with credit card at a pay station in the lobby

• Via phone by scanning the QR code on the parking ticket

• At the exit terminal via credit card.

"People will pull into the garage on High Street, park,

go down to the lobby of the building, and exit as a pedestrian on Washington Avenue," Merli said. "Then they use that lobby to get back into the garage by scanning their parking ticket at the exterior access reader mounted the building to outside doors. the lobby А reader in the lobby can scan their credit card.

"The garage is equipped with intercoms 24 hours a day," he continued. "Intercoms also are at the pay stations, entrance and exit. The garage is remotely monitored 24 hours a day. No staff is on site except during PAC events."

Businesses are able to lease parking spaces for their employees and provide parking validation to their customers to offset costs, Merli said.

Other MCIA parking garages are located on Hardenberg Street in New Brunswick and Pearl Street in Metuchen. More are coming soon to Middlesex College in Edison and North Brunswick Train Station. 

With the summer season now upon us, here's a look at some of the best ways to enjoy the outdoors in Carteret:

Festivals

Few towns offer as many lively festivals as Carteret. On July 3, the Independence Day Festival fireworks, food, music and returns with much more from 6 to 11 p.m. in Carteret Park while the event's usual location, Waterfront Park is under renovation. Thanks to Gold Sponsors The Botanic and Xfinity, Latin Fest will take place 4-11 p.m. on July 26 in Civic Center Park. The celebration of Latin music, dance, food and other culture is one of Central Jersey's most popular events.

The summer festival season in Carteret will conclude Sept. 17 to 21 with the Mayor's Charity Carnival, which includes Carteret's 49th annual Ethnic Day on Sept. 20, a battle of the bands, and an antique car show on Sept. 21. Families can enjoy rides, games and other attractions, as well as a headlining music act at Ethnic Day, all in Carteret Park.

Another enjoyable family event happening this summer season is Saint Joseph Parish 16 Festival, a fundraiser for Saint Joseph School from June 12 to 15 on the school grounds. Highlights will include rides, games, food, raffles and other fun.

Courts & Fields

Carteret prides itself on its parks and their outdoor amenities, especially their courts and fields. Last summer, the Borough opened a brand new court for one of the hottest recreational activities in the country: pickle ball. The pickle ball court is located in Failace Memorial Park on Sycamore Street and Sumutka Avenue. Last spring, Carteret Park's tennis and basketball courts were repaved. And it was not too long ago that Sullivan Field in Carteret Park, as well as all the fields in Civic Center Park were upgraded.

Sports Leagues

Carteret is crazy about baseball, softball and soccer, and youngsters have ample opportunity to participate in all three all summer on those aforementioned fields with Carteret Little League, Kraze Fast Pitch, and Carteret Soccer Academy. Spray grounds & playgrounds

Nearly all of Carteret's amazing parks have impressive playgrounds, and two also have spray grounds: Carteret Park and Bishop Andrews Chrome Park. Both will thrill wee ones and are open now through Labor Day.

Outdoor concerts

Carteret's Summer Concert Series is legendary. At 7 p.m. on Fridays in Carteret Park, some of the region's best bands play weekly all summer. And at 7 p.m. on Sundays, it's the same, typically in Waterfront Park but likely relocated due to renovations. Keep an eye out for the annual Borough of Carteret Recreation Guide for exact details.

Mini Golf and Putting Green

As soon as the renovations in Waterfront Park are complete, folks once again will be able to enjoy the lavish riverside park's miniature golf course and putting green, both of which offer great family fun.

Fishing

Waterfront Park also offers fishing off Veteran's Pier, but in the meantime, Sitar Pond remains stocked in Carteret Park. Weekend fishing is a great way for families to enjoy the outdoors together.

Movies in the Park

Twice a week at 8 p.m. on Wednesdays and Saturdays throughout the summer, Carteret offers familyfriendly films in Carteret Park. The summer schedule of flicks will be announced soon in the Recreation Guide.

Recreation Bus Trips

The Recreation Guide also will have all the details on the latest bus trips that the Borough offers all summer long to such places as the Point Pleasant Beach Boardwalk and Atlantic City.

Exercise in Noe Street Park

Working out in the outdoor gym at Noes Street Park after a warmup walk around the lovely pond and its majestic fountains is a great way to get some exercise and fresh air. Then you can follow the workout with a run around the pond. Walking/running trails also are offered in Medwick Park, Carteret Park, and Waterfront Park once it reopens. 17



CPAC Spotlight: The Rascals

 ${f 1}$ aving gotten their professional start in 1965 at e Choo Choo Club in Garfield, The The Rascals are very much a Jerseyband. Two of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame act's legendary founders, singer-songwriter-keyboardist Felix Cavaliere and guitarist-vocalist Gene Cornish, will return to the Garden State on June 13 to play Carteret, Performing Arts & Events Center. The Rascals' 60th anniversary tour will feature No. 1 hits, such as "Groovin'," "Good Lovin'," and "People Got to Be Free," as well as the signature "A Beautiful Morning." Along with The Righteous Brothers, The Rascals are considered the epitome of American considered epitome the American ot blue-eyed soul. Their influence on the Sounds of legendary. Park While ASDUTY PATK IS legendary. While com-ing up in the mid-to-late 1960s at the Jersey Shore, both Bruce Springsteen and Steve Van Zandt adored The Rascals. The band tapped Van Zandt to induct them into The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1997. "Sopranos" creator David Chase loved Van Zandt's induction speech so much, he cast him as Silvio Dante in the classic HBO series. Steve and his wife Maureen went on to produce the Asbury is com-

Silvio Dante in the classic HBO serie's. Steve and his wife, Maureen, went on to produce the 2012 Broadway production "Once Upon a Dream," a Rascals revue starring the original band members. They also include Garfield-based singer-songwriter-percussionist Eddie Brigati and Jersey City-born drummer Dino Danelli. Unfortunately, Dino died in 2022 and Eddie no longer tours. But Felix and Gene, who hail from New York, have banded together to show why The Rascals also have been inducted into the Grammy, Vocal, Songwriter, Hit Parader and Hammond halls of fame. I spoke with Felix about the band's amazing career, and why it's still fun to share the music with audiences filled with smiling faces.

When The Rascals were starting out at the Choo Choo Club in Garfield, what was the New Jersey music scene like then compared today? Very different. For example, the clubs did not allow you to play your own music. You had to do covers. That was very different. And you had to wear a suit, tie and jacket. You had to be dressed up. That was a major difference.

What is the Choo Choo Club now? I don't know. I live in Nashville now. I know the owner's son. We keep in touch. It was the first place that we were able to work as a band just starting out. The owner, Sal Bonura, gave us a good shot. It was a great place with a lot of people. It got its name because the train tracks were behind the stage, so you know those trains were for real.

How did Sid Bernstein, the guy who brought The Beatles to America, have an impact on The Rascals that led the band to become the first white act signed to Atlantic Records?

While at the Choo Choo Club, a gentleman offered us a job for the summer in the Hamptons on Long Island at a place called The Barge. It was an important opportunity because people within the music industry vacationed there. The gentleman who got us the Hamptons gig knew Sid and introduced us. Sid started managing us, and our pay immediately doubled at The Barge. Then he tried to get us a record deal with Atlantic Records, the only label that would let us produce ourselves. None of the other labels would even hear about that, but they said yes! It was the beginning of a fantastic relationship. fantastic relationship.

What impact did The Rascals have on the Asbury Park music scene of the 1960s, and how did that impact come full circle working with Steve Van Zandt and Bruce Springsteen on occasion since 1982? We were Americans. That was a big deal.

I remember doing an album one time down in the Village. I was looking for 45s for the project. This guy comes up and says, 'Felix, you made it OK for Italians to have long hair.' Prior to that, everybody was English. There was the Lovin' Spoonful, but they were more like folk.

I know we had the R&B influence on Bruce and Steve, and thank God, they influenced us years later. I live in Nashville near a couple of the E Street guys down here. It's definitely come full circle, as you say.

Are you a fan of the HBO series 'The Sopranos?' Yes and no. Yes, because the way Steven got the show was inducting us into The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. David Chase called him up after that.

No, because I don't like the way Italians are depicted. It's a great show, but Italian families are It's that. like Mr. more than (Rodney) Dangerfield said, 'Give us a little respect.' We don't need that crap. Go to Italy. See what real Italians are like.

Shouldn't the Garfield, NJ-formed Rascals also be in the New Jersey Hall of Fame? That's a good question. To be honest, we started in New York City, but we didn't work until we came to New Jersey. It's beautiful that we've been able to work throughout the trigtete area and all have accorded throughout the tristate area, and all have accepted us as theirs. And that's where the most faithful fans are. But we don't call them fans. We call them friends.

Third Annual Central Jersey Marquee Awards Honor the Best High School Musicals

L he 2025 Marquee Awards were presented to Central Jersey high schools and students on May 19 in a Tony Award-style red-carpet event at Carteret Performing Arts & Events Center.

Hosted by Broadway star Justin Matthew Sargent ("Rock of Ages, Spider-Man Turn Off the Dark"), the two-hour ceremony featured live musical performances and celebrated Central Jersey high school on-stage and crew talent.

Now in its third year, the Marquee Awards had 27 high schools in the running from Middlesex, Mercer and Somerset counties.

Awards were given for student achievement in 20 competitive categories, including performances, direction, choreography, theater technology and design. Nominees were selected by a panel of professional judges, who evaluated productions throughout the region during the 2025 spring musical season.

The big Marquee winner this year was Princeton High Schoolwithfiveawardsforitsproduction of "Groundhog Day: The Musical," including Best Supporting Actor (Konrad Hedges), Best Designer & Crew Leaders (Colin Lansky), Best Props Manager (Robin Watchel), Best Direction (Julianna Krawjecki), and Best Scenery.

Juanita Hemingway won the award for Best Hair & Makeup for Carteret High School's production of "The Addams Family."

Best High School Musical went to The Pingry School in the Basking Ridge section of Bernards Township for its production of "Pippin." Pingry also won Best Production Number for "Magic to Do" and Best Chorus. Other winners are:





The steps to Carteret's historic Memorial **Municipal Building** recently were refurbished. Clockwise from top left shows the process of the project. The top left photo shows the steps before the project began. The photo on the bottom right shows the refurbished steps as they are now. And the rest of the photos detail a progression of the project. The steps are now more shallow and, therefore, safer. They also feature a beautiful granite finish. Carteret's Memorial Municipal Building is historic because it is the last "Great War" of its type in Middlesex County. The high level of original details and its homage to World War I also make it a rare survivor in New Jersey. The Memorial Municipal Building was constructed in 1925 and last went under restoration in 2006.




